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Stanislav "Stas" Venglevski, is a native of the Republic of Moldova and a two-time first prize winner of the Bayan competition. He gradated from the Russian Academy of Music in Moscow with a Masters Degree in Music, and in 1992 immigrated to the United States. Stas' repertoire includes his original compositions, and a broad range of classical. contemporary, and ethnic music. He has toured extensively throughout the former Soviet Union, Canada, Europe, and the United States, including numerous performances with Doc Severinsen, Steve Allen, and Garrison Keillor on Prairie Home Companion.

Additionally, he has performed with symphony orchestras throughout the United States, including the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and the Tacoma Symphony Orchestra. He is a regular participant in the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra's Arts in Community Education Program (ACE).

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Zack Durlam, Artistic Director



Dr. Zack Durlam serves as Artistic Director of the Master Singers of Milwaukee, Director of Choral Activities at the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee, and choir director at Grace Lutheran Church in Grafton, Wisconsin. At UWM, Durlam leads multiple choirs and teaches graduate and undergraduate conducting and choral literature. He previously taught at Fresno Pacific University where his Concert Choir performed at the California Music Educators Association Conference and he was awarded the university's 2013 Faculty Distinguished Service Award. Prior to that, Durlam taught high school vocal music for twelve years—including nine at lowa City West where his Chamber Choir was chosen to perform at the North Central American Choral Directors Association (NCACDA) conference and the music

department was one of seven programs in the nation named a Gold Signature School by the Grammy Foundation. He received his bachelor's degree from Luther College, master's from the University of Iowa, and doctorate from Michigan State University. Durlam was awarded 3rd place in the college/university division of the 2018–2019 American Prize for Choral Conducting, and the UWM Concert Chorale and UWM combined choirs and orchestra were named national finalists in the same competition. The UWM Concert Chorale under his direction has been featured at the Wisconsin Choral Directors Association (WCDA) and Wisconsin Music Educators Association state conferences and the 2020 tenstate Midwestern ACDA conference. In fall of 2021 they performed with Andrea Bocelli during the Milwaukee stop of his "Believe" tour, and in 2015 they performed with the Rolling Stones at Milwaukee's Summerfest. Durlam has presented at state and regional conferences of ACDA and the National Association for Music Educators, and he frequently works as a guest conductor, and clinician. Durlam currently serves as president of WCDA.

Jayne Latva, Pianist



Jayne Latva is a freelance keyboard player who enjoys a wide variety of assignments. As a staff accompanist for the Houston and Milwaukee Ballet companies, she was the soloist in over 20 productions. In 2012 Jayne presented a paper entitled *Robert Schumann's Six Fugues on B-A-C-H: Inner Workings Inner World* at the national convention of the American Guild of Organists. A collection of her arrangements of Asian hymns is published by Augsburg. Jayne holds a doctorate in Piano Literature and Pedagogy from Indiana University.
